What are Public Utility Districts?

PUDs are locally-controlled, not-for-profit utilities owned and held accountable but not by the communities we serve. PUDs operate their own systems and exist to meet the needs of our customer-owners. PUDs are governed by locally-elected Boards of Commissioners that live in the communities they serve.

Twenty-eight public utility districts serve approximately one million residential, business and industrial customers in 27 counties with not-for-profit services that keep rates down and reliability high while meeting the unique needs of the Communities PUDs serve.

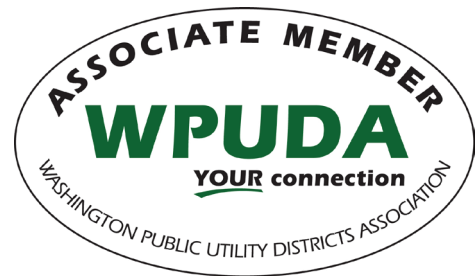
