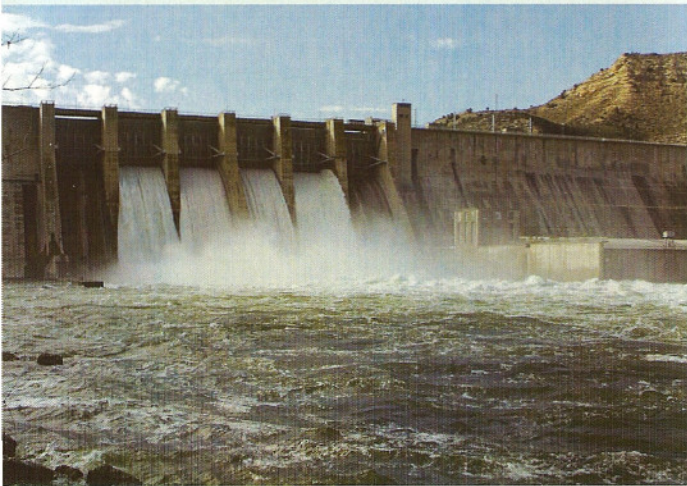


## Become an Associate Member of the **Washington Public Utility Districts Association (WPUDA)**

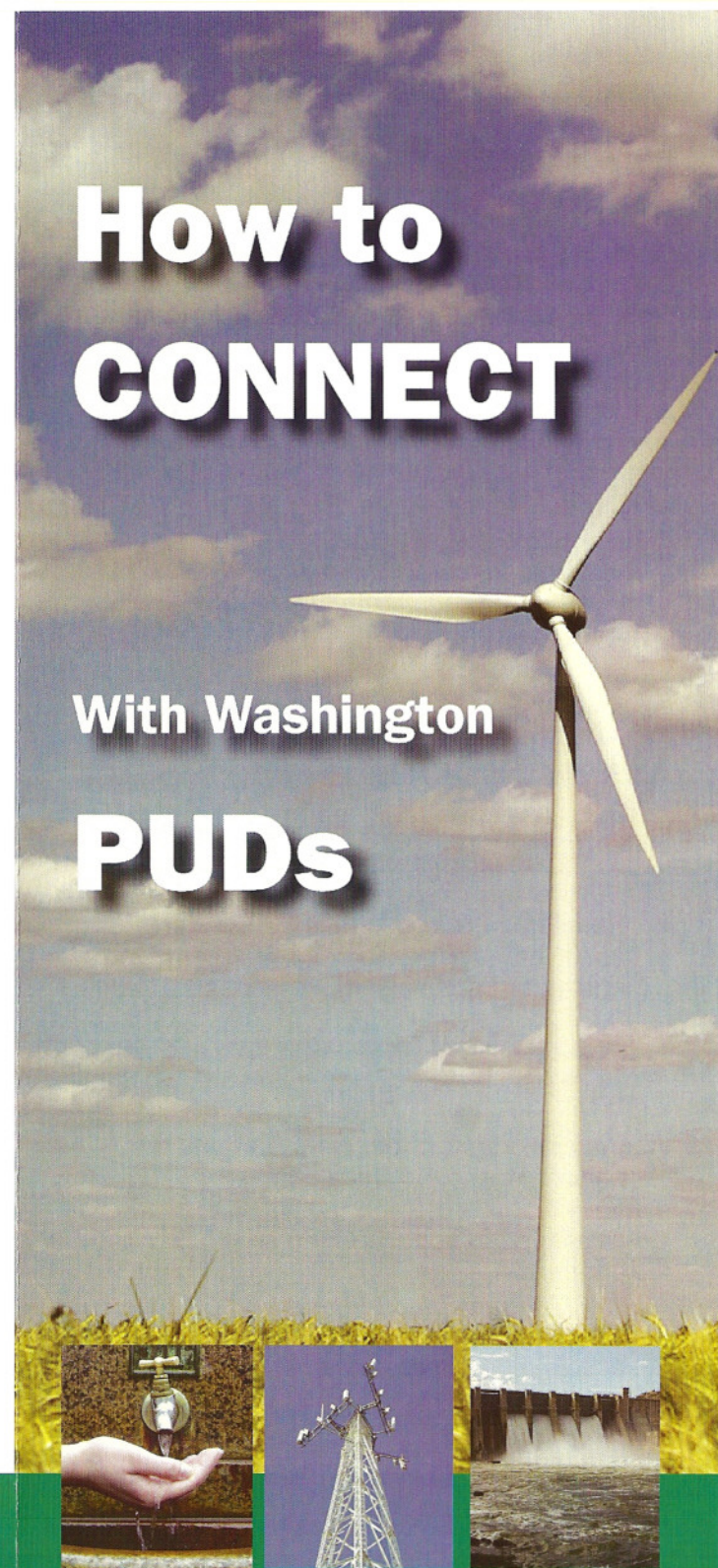

### Level II—\$500/year

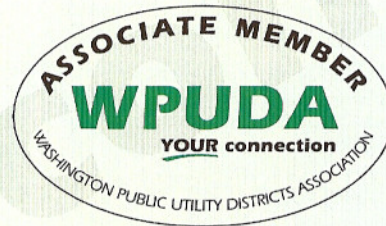
Firms with 11 to 100 employees (total company, not branches)

## What are Public Utility Districts?

In Washington, the citizens of each county have the right to organize their own public utility district. There are 28 PUDs in Washington that provide electricity, water, sewer service and wholesale telecommunications to 2.2 million people.

PUDs are owned by the communities they serve, so they exist to provide service—not to make a profit. They encourage production and use of renewable energy, promote conservation in their communities, and offer programs to assist customers in using energy and water efficiently.
